

**GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Bring a photo ID and your insurance card.
- For your safety, your anesthesiologist prefers that you do not smoke or drink alcohol 48 hours prior to surgery.
- You must have someone with you who will remain in waiting area during your procedure and to drive you home. We will cancel your procedure if a driver does not come with you. After your procedure, you will not be allowed to drive a vehicle, operate machinery, make legal decisions or drink alcohol for 24 hours.
- Bring in advance directive/living will if available.
- Do not wear make-up, nail polish or jewelry on the day of surgery and give all belongings such as glasses, contacts, dentures, clothes, etc. to family prior to procedure.
- Tell your doctor if you have a cold, sore throat, cough or fever before your procedure.

**MEDICATION INSTRUCTIONS:**

- No gum or candy the morning of your procedure.
- Do not take any iron supplements for 7 days.
- **Unless given specific medication instructions at a presurgical appointment, please follow these medication instructions:**
  - Do not take diabetic pills the evening prior or morning of your procedure
  - Cut insulin dose in half the evening prior to procedure and hold morning insulin dose the day of procedure
  - Take heart, blood pressure, pain meds, seizure and Parkinson's medications with a sip of water 2 hours prior to arrival time
  - If you are taking aspirin, NSAIDS or are on blood thinners, please contact the physician that prescribed the medication for further instructions

**PRE-PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Clear liquid diet for \_\_\_\_\_ days prior to procedure.
- **Please note: Milk, creamer and citrus juices are NOT considered clear liquids.**
- Nothing to eat or drink after Midnight the night prior to procedure.
